DISMISSAL HYMN 430 vs. 5-7

Our theme for Lent this year for our 11:00 a.m. service is "O Love How Deep, How Broad, How High." It is taken from the hymn with the same title, Lutheran Service Book 544. This sermon series will set out to trace the enormous dimensions of God's merciful love for sinners in Christ. The primary goal is that we may more fully comprehend and rejoice in "the breadth and length and height and depth, of the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge." A second goal is that we would come to associate each of the many dimensions of God's great love and mercy elaborated in this series with the suffering and death of Christ, enriching our Lenten meditation and our ongoing understanding of the cross. A third goal is that God's enormous love for us would move us to live in love and mercy towards others. Today we reflect on God's enormous love that spares no cost. How do we measure someone's love for someone else? There is no greater measure than we see in Jesus Christ. His humbling Himself to come to earth, taking on all our sins and dying on the cross to pay the price in full. Today we will consider all this in a message entitled, "Love That Spares No Cost."

Lent is the period of 40 days (not including Sundays) prior to Easter. It is a season of reflection and preparation prior to the death and resurrection of Jesus. Lent is a time to observe and commemorate the final 40 days of Christ's life. it is a time to reflect on our religious practices, strengthen our faith in God and embody the lessons of Christ. The word "lent" comes from the Old English, "lencten" which means "spring." Liturgical changes reflect the season. Hope's Holy Week services, *The Three Days*, are 7 p.m. April 6, 7, 8 (Holy <u>Thursday</u>, Good <u>Friday</u>, <u>Saturday</u> Easter Vigil). Our 74th Easter Sunrise Service will be April 9 at 6:30 a.m. at Wilson Park.

OTHER NOTES: In conjunction with the other two Granite City Lutheran Churches there will be another Lenten service at 7:00 p.m. tonight at Concordia. The three church evening services have a different theme than these 11:00 a.m. services. Also, a friendly reminder, this Saturday night we switch to Daylight Savings Time. "Spring ahead one hour." And finally, it has been decided that we will have an Easter breakfast at 8:30 a.m. for members of Hope. It will be served family style, similar to last year. A sign-up sheet is now on the hallway bulletin board.
