THEME FOR THE DAY: We will once again be using our Epistle reading as a basis for our meditation this morning. At this time we have moved on from the Book of Philippians (Paul's letter to Philippi) to the Book of First Thessalonians (Paul's letter to Thessalonica), In this opening of the letter, Paul speaks of hope. Hope is so important to us and that all people have hope. But Paul is not talking here about fleeting hope but hope in the Lord.
