**FINAL RESULTS FOR FORTY DAYS FOR LIFE.** For this campaign, September 27 – November 5, there were 1,846 hours of prayers on the sidewalk at the Granite City Abortion Clinic (all 40 days, 12 hours per day, were covered in prayerful and peaceful manner). This is the second most hours prayed in a campaign. Five lives were saved and many other hopefuls. In addition, fruits of the 40 days continued to over flow. Early the week of November 5 (after the campaign) two additional lives were saved. In total, since the inception of 40 Days for Life in Granite City, there have been 9 campaigns with 97 lives saved and 14,500 hours prayed. Thank you to all who helped support this.

**THEME FOR THE DAY:** On this second to the last Sunday of the Church Year we again look at end times and Judgment Day. Today we do this in the Parable of the Talents that Jesus teaches us with in our Gospel reading. A first, quick, misunderstanding look at this parable might leave one thinking that we must earn salvation and I hope I've done enough. But, of course, that is not at all the case. As with all the parables, we must look at Jesus as the central figure and what He has done for us; and then respond accordingly to Him. Today we will consider all this in a message entitled, "Your Response Is As How You See God."
